
2.10 Academic Detailing, 2023-24





Kaitlyn Ranasinghe is the Program Manager at BridgeNorth. She has been involved in anti-trafficking advocacy for many years and turned this passion into a career when she began working in the field in 2017. She has experience conducting research on human trafficking and anti-human trafficking efforts, working with and providing support to survivors of human trafficking, as well as public education and advocacy. Kaitlyn is dedicated to building and sharing knowledge that inspires structural and systemic change at all levels to help fight and prevent human trafficking in Canada.

Dr. Michael Bartucci has been a long-time champion and advocate for 2SLGBTQ+ health. He is a staff physician and the former medical director at the Hassle Free Clinic, which is a community-based clinic in Toronto, providing medical and counselling services in all areas of sexual health. He also works rurally at the municipality of Red Lake, Ontario, as a family physician. He is the founder of Helping Hands Philippines, a Canadian charity which provides equitable community health services to underserved communities in the Philippines.

Dr. Neely Bakshi is a consultant psychiatrist at Health for All Family Health Team, and he also has clinical appointments at Oak Valley Health and at the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health. His clinical interests are in general psychiatric care and early psychosis intervention. He has been involved in the teaching of residents and medical students.

Dr. Andrew Patterson has practiced Family Medicine from 1976 to 2016 in Nova Scotia, West Germany, and Stouffville. He was the first Chief of Family Medicine at Markham Stouffville Hospital in 1989. He then became Chief of Palliative and Long Term Care until he stepped down in 2020 to concentrate on home visiting palliative care. He has been associated with Health for All from its beginning and supervised the hospital palliative rotation and arranged home visits for residents to experience. In his spare time, you will find him either mountain biking, playing hockey or skiing.

Ms. Shairoz Somji is a Registered Nurse at St Mary's General Hospital in Kitchener. She works very closely with IMI (Imamia Medics International), a global organization dedicated to promoting quality health and education in disadvantaged communities. She has spent her valuable time at Imam Al-Hujjah Hospital in Iraq educating their nurses in a variety of skills. She also worked closely with management to help the hospital gain accreditation.

Dr. Karuna Gupta has been practicing as a family physician for over twenty years. Since 2013 she has been an office based family physician and teacher with Health for All Family Health Team in Markham, Ontario and lecturer with the Department of Family and Community Medicine at the University of Toronto. Formerly serving as Lead Physician and Board Chair, Dr. Gupta is currently the Co-Director of Quality Improvement at Health for All. This role gives her an opportunity to bring the joy she finds in quality improvement work to team-based clinical care, teaching, academic work, and collaborations beyond the clinic walls.

Dr. Kevin Kain is a Professor of Medicine at the University of Toronto and a director at the Sandra Rotman Center for Global Health and Science Director of the Tropical Disease Unit at UHN. He also holds a Canada Research Chair in Molecular Parasitology. Dr. Kain's research and clinical interests include developing new diagnostics, drugs, and vaccines for the prevention and treatment of malaria and other emerging infectious diseases associated with tropical medicine. His research efforts also include focuses on global health and equity as well as knowledge sharing and education. Dr. Kain has worked extensively in the tropics including New Guinea, Uganda, Kenya, Tanzania, Malawi, Madagascar, Honduras, Laos, Thailand, Indonesia, and the Amazon basin. He has also served as a board member or consultant to many organizations including the Gates Foundation, Grand Challenges Canada, WHO, Red Cross, Canadian Blood Services, and the CDC.

5.2 DFCM Collaboration in Ghana

Under the leadership of the Office of the Vice President International (OVPI) and in partnership with the Mastercard Foundation and five African institutes in higher education, the University of Toronto is engaging in a network to collectively address shared health sector challenges. The DFCM was invited to collaborate with the Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology (KNUST), one of eight initial partners of the African Higher Education Collaborative, to develop a series of Continuing Professional Development programs to enhance the competency of primary care providers in a number of key areas, including quality improvement.

A team of physicians from the DFCM led by Dr. Margarita Lam-Antoniades worked with our KNUST colleagues on the co-creation and delivery of a Healthcare Quality course. This course aimed to provide participants (frontline healthcare providers and administration leadership) with the skills and knowledge to apply the concepts of quality improvement to their work with patients, healthcare management, and larger primary care organizations in Ghana. In fall 2023, Drs. Margarita Lam-Antoniades, Susanna Fung, Mike Taglione, and **Karuna Gupta** (Oak Valley Health) travelled to Ghana to deliver this two-part course in collaboration with our Ghanaian colleagues.
